## Shelter

If you are bringing a tent:

- Tent: (including Poles, Stakes, Guy lines)
- Tent foot print/tarp
- Mallet (for stakes)

## Bedding

- Sleeping pad, mats, cot, or air mattress (and air pump)
- Blanket, comforter, or sleeping bag
- Pillows

## For the Camp Site

- Flashlight/Headlight
- Extra Batteries
- Multi-purpose tool
- Camp chairs / Folding chairs
- Folding table
- Bug Repellant
- Sun glasses
- First AID Kit / Snake Kit
- Tissues

- Dog First AID Kit
- Long lasting treats
- Extra Towels
- Tie-Out / Leash
- Poop Bags
- Dog Tent or Shade for Dog
- Entertainment (toys, balls, fetchables)
- Dog Life Jacket
- Sun screen

## Clothing and laundry

- T-shirts
- Shorts, pants
- Boots, shoes
- Shower Shoes / Flip Flops
- Socks
- Hat, cap
- Sweater, jacket
- Neck gaiter / buff / scarf
- Underwear
- Sleep wear
- Swimsuit

## Personal Items

- Towels, washcloths
- Laundry bags
- Contact Solution

Acorn Campground has potable water, so you do not need to bring water. There are also restrooms with accessible flush toilets.

There is a boat ramp and there will be plenty of free time for water sports of all kinds.

Dogs are welcome, but must be on a leash or crated. Please make sure, if you bring your dog, that you bring poop bags so you can clean up after your dog.

If you have a guitar, a percussion instrument, and/or songs to sing – bring them! We'll have fun around the fire with some music.

There can only be two cars per campsite. The extra cars will have to be parked in the visitor's parking spaces.

Saturday night we will have an all-camp potluck. Bring your best camp dish to share. All other meals are up to you to plan. You may want to work with other campers to coordinate shared meals.
